Important Information to Consider Before Applying

Tuition: (TBD)

A **\$300 non-refundable registration deposit** is required within **5 days of acceptance** to secure your place in the school.

The **remaining tuition balance (TBD)** must be paid **before arriving in Mozambique**.

Major Expenses to Consider

- **Flights:**

Depending on your departure city, round-trip flights typically range from **\$1,900–\$2,200 USD**.

All flights must arrive at **Beira, Mozambique (Airport Code: BEW)** as the final destination. Transportation will be provided from the airport to the ministry base.

- **Visas:**

Mozambique can be particular about visa requirements. To participate in the School, students **must obtain a visa before arrival through the official E-Visa portal**, regardless of what other sources online may say about alternative options or services.

A **flight itinerary must be uploaded when applying for the visa**, so students should plan accordingly. Visa costs typically range from **\$315–\$475 USD**, depending on the processing and fees charged. Payment is usually made through the e-visa website at the time of application. More detailed instructions will be provided after acceptance.

- **Travel / Health Insurance:**

Travel health insurance is **mandatory**, and proof of coverage must be submitted before arrival.

Your insurance policy **must include emergency evacuation coverage**, including **helicopter transport and medical evacuation out of the country if necessary**.

Other Financial Info

Phone/Internet:

If you have an unlocked smartphone (not locked to a carrier such as AT&T or Sprint), you should be able to easily purchase a local SIM card and use mobile service while in Mozambique. **E-SIM is not supported**. Depending on the plan, this typically costs **\$10–\$15 USD**.

If your phone is currently locked, please contact your carrier before traveling to request that it be unlocked.

While not mandatory, **having a phone with local service is extremely important** for communication and logistics during outreach and Crusade Week. Students without a phone may have difficulty coordinating transportation, meeting locations, and outreach teams.

Please note that **Wi-Fi is not available for students on the base**, so a phone with a local SIM card and data will likely be necessary.

Travel during the School

Transport:

Your tuition covers all local ground transportation during school activities but does not include personal travel.

Food:

Tuition includes basic local meals prepared daily in the kitchen and during outreach. These meals are simple local dishes that typically include rice, beans, fish, greens, and occasionally chicken.

There are a few small grocery stores within walking distance that sell additional food items, though the selection is limited. In Dondo, there are also a few restaurants where you can buy pizza, beef, and other traditional meals.

Restaurant meals typically cost **\$7–\$15 USD**, depending on what you order. These meals are optional and **not included in tuition**.

Accommodation:

During the School of Evangelism, your tuition includes lodging at the training center.

During outreach and Crusade Week, students will stay in tents at a house in the city where the evangelism activities will take place.

If available, students may choose to rent a hotel room during Crusade Week, but this cannot be guaranteed. Hotels in Mozambique are typically basic and cost between **\$35–\$100 per night**. This expense is **not included in tuition** and would need to be covered personally.

Health

Immunizations:

Mozambique does not require specific immunizations for most visitors. However, if you are traveling from a country where yellow fever is present, you may be asked to show proof of yellow fever vaccination when entering the country.

Malaria:

Malaria is present in Mozambique. Students will receive more detailed information about malaria prevention and recommendations before arrival.

Illness:

Most common medications are available in Mozambique if you become ill while attending the school. Students will also receive a list of recommended health and personal care items to bring with them.

STRUCTURE

SEPTEMBER-OCTOBER

The School of Evangelism will take place **September - October 2026** in **Dondo, Mozambique**. This page is intended to provide a general overview of what students can expect during the school.

Applications will open, and the finalized schedule will be released on April 20th, 2026. At that time, confirmed dates, tuition costs, and full program details will be available.

Students who are accepted into the school will receive a **Student Manual** prior to arrival with detailed information, including required reading, recommended supplies, and additional preparation for classroom training and outreach.

General School Outline (Tentative)

This outline is intended to give applicants a general idea of the structure of the school. Specific dates, locations, and timing may change as plans are finalized.

Arrival & Orientation

Students will arrive at the Iris Global base in **Dondo, Mozambique** for check-in and orientation. During this time students will meet the leadership team, become familiar with the base, and receive preparation for the weeks ahead.

Classroom Training

The first portion of the school will include classroom instruction focused on evangelism, ministry training, and practical preparation for outreach. Teaching sessions will typically take place during the day.

Evenings may include worship, prayer, guest speakers, and teaching from Iris Global leaders and ministry partners.

Local Outreach & Ministry Practice

Students will participate in local evangelism opportunities in nearby communities. These outreaches are designed to help students practice sharing the Gospel, praying for people, and ministering alongside experienced outreach teams.

Gospel Crusade Preparation

Students will assist with preparation for large Gospel Crusade events. This may include logistical preparation, prayer, evangelism training, and working alongside local church leaders.

Gospel Crusade Outreach

Students will travel with the ministry team to participate in one or more large Gospel Crusade events in surrounding regions. These events include daytime conferences for pastors and leaders and evening evangelistic gatherings where many people attend.

Students will participate in evangelism, prayer ministry, and supporting the outreach teams during these events.

Return & Departure

At the conclusion of the outreach activities, students will return to the Dondo base before departing for their home countries.
